- Attended the TVHS graduation banquet.
- Meeting at South Central Forestry and the Forest Products Association in Fredericton. Mayor Fenner delivered a speech that was well accepted by all present and has been asked to return again as a guest speaker. The Plaster Rock Mill was highlighted during this meeting and it was noted that production has increased. Subjects covered included re-forestation and natural gas extraction.
- RSC meeting in Woodstock. It was suggested that a regional recreation committee be created to develop action plans that ensure recreational activities in all areas of zone 12. Also discussed was regional economic development. The meeting with the police representatives has been delayed due to the recent RCMP events in Moncton.
- Over the past few months Mayor Fenner has been in constant contact with the Energy East Pipeline. In her efforts to bring a camp to our area she has asked council to pass a motion to offer support and also to welcome Energy East Pipeline to the area. She has also asked for a motion to have temporary signs erected in the village at a cost of \$360.
